DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club Limited offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the
 route to the show is a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased
 time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle
- Keep the dog in the shade- take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dogs welfare.

WARNING IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club Limited licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dogs health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise.

Breach of Kennel Club Limited Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Limited Rules and Regulations.

Right to refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Limited Regulations to refuse any entry.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The show will open at 12 NOON
- 2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 1PM.
- 4. Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging is completed.
- 5. ENTRY FEES: Members £5.00 per dog first class, Non-Members £6.00 for 1st entry for each dog. All subsequent entries per dog £1.00. Not for Competition £1 per dog.
- 6. PRIZE MONEY: Stakes Class only—1st £5: 2nd £4: 3rd £3: Reserve £2: VHC £1
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.
- 10. Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed. Where a Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
- 11. **Best in Show.** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs.

Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.

- 12. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them <u>nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move.</u> This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Board under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11
- 13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 14. No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 15. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of dogs for Exhibition.
- 16. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 17. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dogs(s) are met, and should not put a dogs health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. Breech of Kennel Club Rules and Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Your dog vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

If your vehicle is not air conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definition a Challenge Certificate includes any show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognized by the Kennel Club Limited . . Wins at Championship show in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members classes or competing for Members Specials each partner must, at the time of entry, be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

- 1. Withdrawal: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations F(1) 19.
- 2. Transfer:
- (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards it's colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- (b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy, Puppy class or Junior class which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, the Junior class or the Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- (c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- (d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day or the show. PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the show. JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the show.

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Minor Puppy classes excepted whether restricted or not).

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes whether restricted or not.

LIMIT For dogs which have not won 3 Challenge Certificates under 3 different judges or 7 or more First prizes in all, at Championship shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show

SPECIAL LAKELAND TERRIER DOG OR BITCH NOT IN SHOW TRIM For beginners, whose dog is not in show trim.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than 7 years of age on the first day of the show

STAKES Open to all with the exception of BIS, RBIS, & BPIS who will be obliged to withdraw their entry.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (Annex B)

- 1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Limited Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Limited RuleA11.
- (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
- (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under RuleA11.
- 2. (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
- (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- 3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
- (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the Board.
- (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
- (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club Limited before neutered dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the Board to deceive.

- **4.** The Board without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club Limited in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class

An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club Limited. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate), to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club Limited will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.

6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and **AT RISK** if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused

- 18 Any owner, competitor handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Anyone failing to clear up will be reported to the Board who may enforce the right to refuse entries from the exhibitor for future shows.
- 19 The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog(s) at a Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This regulation applies before(at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterward(at anytime during the breakdown of the event). 20 A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been: a)registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency: b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
- 21 Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.
- 22 Abide by Rules. The show will be held under Kennel Club Limited Rules and Show Regulations. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries at this show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by Kennel Club Limited Rules and Regulations and by these Regulations, and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
